

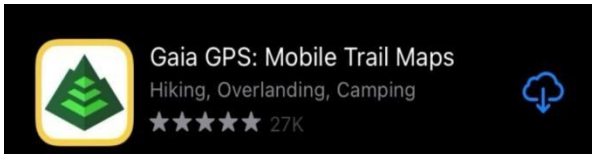

Step 1. Download Gaia GPS: Mobile Trail Maps App



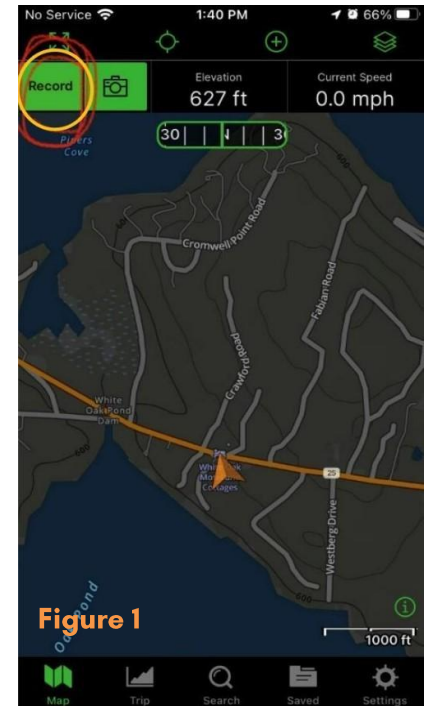
Step 2. Create an account and accept disclaimer

Allow location and camera permissions while using app

RECORDING A SURVEY

Step 1. Recording Weed Watcher Track with Gaia GPS

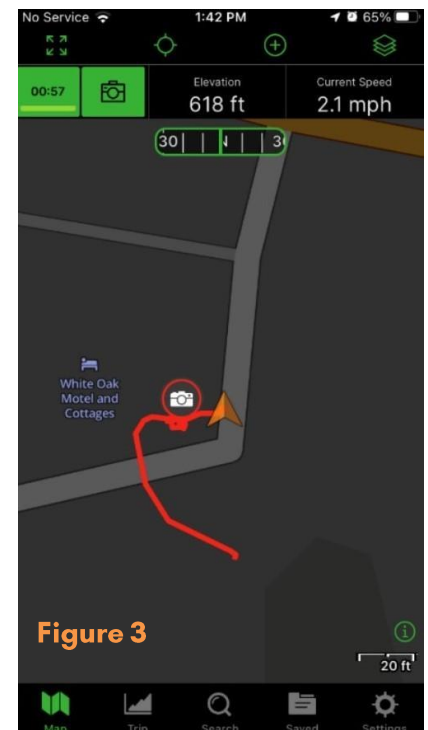
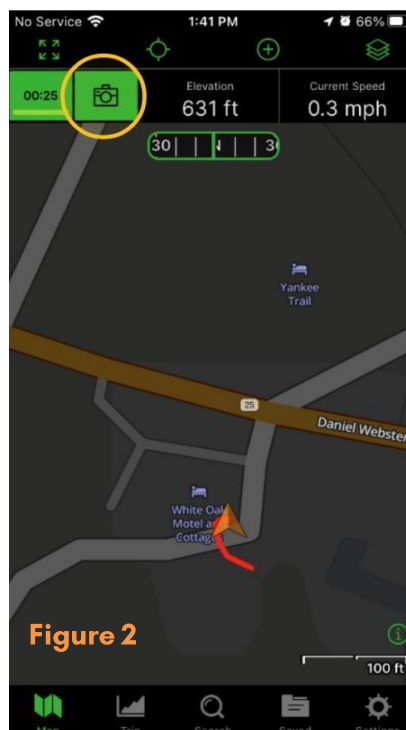
To begin, click **Record** in the top left corner (figure 1). Once you record, you will see a stopwatch recording the length of your activity on this button.



Step 2: Recording an Observation:

Gaia GPS allows you to take geolocated photos of specious plants, important waypoints, and interesting sites along your route and will automatically log the locations of the waypoints.

Click the **Camera** button in the top left (figure 2). You may need to allow access to your phone's camera for this. When you're satisfied with the photo, click use photo. You will then see a camera picture where you snapped the photo along the route (figure 3).

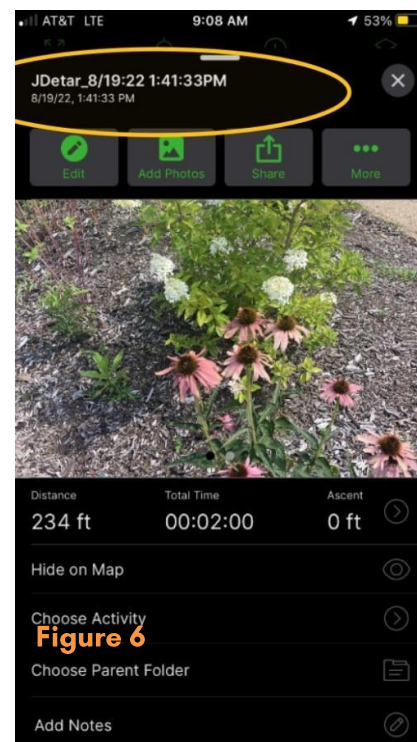
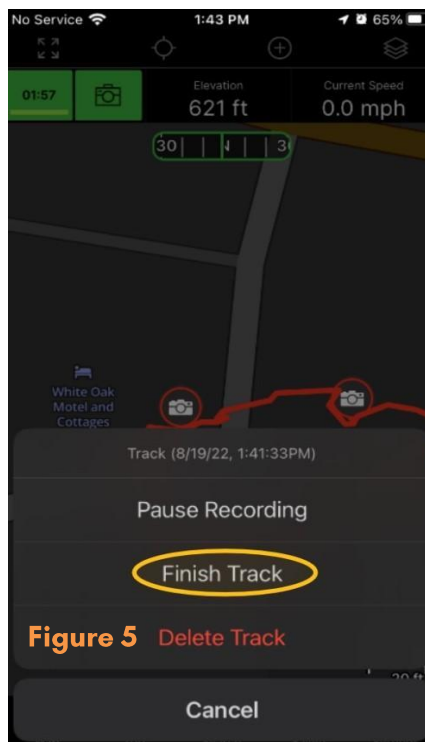


Step 3. Completing/ Saving your Weed Watcher Track.

When you've completed your route, click the green stopwatch/record button in the top left, then select **Finish Track** (Figure 5). You can also pause your track this way by selecting **Pause Recording**.

Here you can rename your recorded track using the following format: First initial Last Name_Date Time (figure 6)

Example: JDoe_8/19/22 1:41:33PM



Sending your track to NLRA

Click the grey and green **Share** button located below the image of your recorded track -on Android phones, click the **More** button (figure 7). Then select **Export File** and select **KML** as the file type (figures 8 and 9). Click on the **Share** button and email your track to Paul Pellissier, NLRA Conservation Manager, at paulenewfoundlake.org
